Department News:

August is always a busy month. The race in Bristol usually increases traffic and visitors for several days. In addition, the end of the traditional vacation season draws many visitors to town for that last minute get-away. For the police department, August is the mid-point of our tourist season.

For the month of August the department responded to 396 calls for service. We were able to close all but 35 of those calls. This gave us an overall clearance rate of 91.1 percent for the month. The department responded to 46 IBR reportable cases in the month of July; at the conclusion of the month, 28 remained active. This resulted in a clearance rate of 39.1 percent for all IBR offenses during the month of August.

Our activities for August were many varied. The agency participated in several events throughout the month. Some of the highlights include:

- August 10th- The agency, along with the Washingotn County Sheriff's Office, Bristol Police Department, and Virginia State Police policed the Trump campaign visit at the Higher Education Center. This visit was the first to the region for the candidate and brought several thousand people to Abingdon.
- August 13th- Officers provided a police car for the Touch-A-Truck event at Abingdon Baptist Church. This event encouraged youth to interact with police, fire, and rescue personnel.
- August 13th- The department held the APD Family Picnic at the Alvarado shelter on the Creeper Trail. The afternoon was wet, but filled with fellowship and great food.
- August 18th- Abingdon was recognized as one of the Safest Places in

- August 18th- Officers worked the United Way Kick-Off Event at Higher Ed Center. They had a chance to provide security for the event and meet Coaches Frank Beamer and Philip Fulmer.

- August 25th- Officer Heath presented at the Washington County Library on Internet Safety.
- August 31st & September 1st- Officers attended Project Lifesaver Training. This program is currently administered by the Washington County Sheriff's Office, but they were in need of additional officers to train in the event of a life-saver emergency. Project Lifesaver is a program to locate people who go missing and are suffering from dementia.



Throughout the month of August the department was recognized by many agencies and groups who demonstrated their appreciation for the officers. Throughout the month staff members received food and treat bags form the following groups: Antioch Preschool Academy, Highlands Fellowship, Frontier Health, and the Elderspirit Community.

On August 10th, Universal Fibers held a Law Enforcement Appreciation Dinner at the Hugher Education Center for law enforcement officers in this region. In addition to a great dinner, officers received t-shirts from Universal Fibers.

We greatly appreciate the gifts and expressions of support from the Abingdon community.

the tax payers of \$912.74 for the month. This equates to \$76.06 per mental health event during the month of August.

Enforcement News:

The department conducted DMV overtime enforcement during the month of August. Four (4) officers worked an additional 33 hours of enforcement on six (6) different dates. Enforcement focused on high crash areas, as well as the work zone on Jonesboro Road. These officers conducted sixteen (16) traffic stops, issuing five (5) warnings and fourteen (14) citations. Thirteen of the citations were for excessive speed and one was for another traffic infraction. Officers also made two arrests from the traffic stop contacts. The agency expended \$901.21 in overtime enforcement this month. The funds expended are reimbursed by the Virginia Department of Motor Vehicles through a grant.




