Department News:

October is probably my favorite month of the year. The changes that occur throughout the month are always welcome and refreshing. In addition, October is when we celebrate my favorite holiday, Halloween. However, the police department was busy the entire month. We were honored to participate in several activities throughout the month.

- October 1st- St. John's Lutheran Church held a Law Enforcement Appreciation Luncheon. This kind gesture allowed for officers to stop by to meet several of the parishioners and enjoy a meal. They also provided attendees with a patrol survival bag.
- October 5th- The department was asked to attend Abingdon
 Elementary for Community Helper Week. We were able to take two
 patrol cars and allow all of the kindergarten classes to sit in the
 driver's seat and interact with officers.





- October 6th- Officer DeBusk, Officer Lucy and Sgt. Shepherd of the Washington County Sheriff's Office were honored with a Coin Ceremony by VFW Post 1994. This was in recognition of their actions during a recent structure fire.
- October 12th- The agency was asked to set up a display at the VDOT Career Fair at the Higher Education Center. This was very well attended by high school seniors in our region.
- October 21st/22nd- A large scale emergency services drill was held in Abingdon over two days. This event provided



- an opportunity for police, fire, EMS, hazardous materials units, and bomb technicians to practice for an actual event. The event was held in the cul-de-sac on French Moore Jr. Blvd. A special thanks to the parks and recreation department for all of their help.
- October 28th- The agency was asked to speak at Glade Middle School for Red Ribbon Week. The entire student body heard a presentation about, "Five Drugs that make you Ugly." This was the culmination of a week of activities and lectures designed to keep students drug free for life.
- October 31st Halloween began with the department participating in a "Trunk or Treat" at Sinking Spring Pre-School. This was a lot of fun for the students, but was especially rewarding for the staff who participated. We decorated our crime scene van and provided candy to all of the young goblins who attended. Later, patrols were increased to provide additional staff for traditional trick or treat hours. I am happy to report that the night was very calm.



• The department also participated in a statewide Halloween Tweet Along. Through this, the agency constantly updated safety tips, traffic conditions, and officer activities via twitter. Officer Richardson was chosen to be the chauffeur for the Tweet Along. Loaded with candy, stickers, and glow sticks, she and Ms. Montgomery made their way through neighborhoods providing glow sticks to those without lights or reflective costumes and treats for those who were prepared. This was a very well received initiative that we may expand next year.

During the month of October the police department spent <u>13 hours</u> either waiting in the ER with ECO patients or in transport of TDO patients. This came at a <u>direct, unsubsidized, cost to the</u> <u>tax payers of \$550.07</u> for the month. This equates to \$137.51 per mental health event during the month of October.

For the month of October the department responded to 381 calls for service. We were able to close all but 20 of those calls. This gave us an overall clearance rate of 94.7 percent for the month. The department responded to 40 IBR reportable cases in the month of October; at the conclusion of the month, 17 remained active. This resulted in a clearance rate of 57.5 percent for all IBR offenses during the month of October.

Enforcement News:

The department did not conduct DMV overtime enforcement during the month of October. The grant period expired at the end of September. However, the department has been approved for renewal and we are awaiting the final award document for 2017.






