### **Department News:**

January is a time of new beginnings. We anticipate the return of warm weather and the great joys that accompany spring. The month of January is a time for the police to begin planning for the coming year. Our calendar is usually very busy and January is a good time to get an outline of the coming year. However, January is not a time to sit back and wait on February. Throughout the month we were engaged in several community events and opportunities to serve in non-traditional roles. Some of those events included:

January 4<sup>th</sup>: the Department created an account Instagram to connect with a younger demographic. Instagram is designed as a photo sharing site, designed to connect with the visual component of social media. We plan to use it as a way to show what we do, events we attend, road conditions, etc. The approach is a little less serious and designed to be visual. One of our first posts was a snow covered cruiser on a snow covered Main Street, in front of the courthouse. Not only does this show that we are still on patrol, it is a way to visually depict the road conditions.



• January 9<sup>th</sup>: Law Enforcement Appreciation Day. We had several organizations and individuals recognize our officers for their efforts. Many people wore blue and others brought food to the office. Councilman Howard was one of many citizens who changed their front porch light to blue for the event and Councilman Craig and his wife were one of six families who delivered handwritten thank you cards to the office.

Food City invited multiple agencies to their corporate office for breakfast and demonstrated their support by wearing blue. We even had support from our youngest fans!







- January 24<sup>th</sup>: Officer Heath was invited to speak at Glade Spring Middle School parent teacher association about the dangers associated with social media. Officer Heath provided tips and advice on the different types of Apps kids are using and some of the potential dangers involving those apps.
- January 26<sup>th</sup>: Officer Heath conducted a technology presentation at Highlands Community Services. His topic was centered around social media sites and mobile apps that students are using, and to make the staff more aware of social media sites that students use to communicate with each other.
- January 26<sup>th</sup>: Chief Sullivan spoke at Christ the King Catholic Church about church security ideas. There was a good crowd who were eager to discuss ways to make their facility a safer place during, and outside of, worship hours.

### **Emergency Custody Order to Temporary Detention Order**

During the month of November the police department spent <u>50 hours</u> either waiting in the ER with ECO patients or in transport of TDO patients. This came at a <u>direct, unsubsidized, cost to</u> <u>the tax payers of \$1,319.21</u> for the month. This equates to \$119.92 per mental health event during the month of December.

### **School Resource Officers Report - January**

### **Disciplinary Referrals:**

During the month of January the School Resource Officers had no reportable incidents for service. However, both Officers had incidents that involved counseling of students for situations that were not criminal in nature but could evolve to be. With the officers taking proactive steps ahead of time, the issues are usually resolved before they turn criminal and require police or court intervention. Some of these incidents include:

- Daily security checks to ensure the security and safety of staff and students in the buildings.
- Officer Heath checked on students that had missed several days of school without notification from their guardian as to where they may be.
- On 1/4 Officer Heath checked on a student that had been absent for numerous days in a row. After speaking to the parent it was found the family was considering home schooling options.
   Information was relayed back to school system.
- On 1/20 Officer Heath spoke to a group of 6th grade girls who had been having problems with social media. Officer Heath spoke them about the danger of posting false information on social media and how such actions could lead to potential criminal charges.

### **Calls for Service:**

For the month of January the department responded to 330 calls for service. We were able to close all but 16 of those calls. This gave us an overall clearance rate of 95.1 percent for the month. The department responded to 33 IBR reportable cases in the month of January; at the conclusion of the month, 12 remained active. This resulted in a clearance rate of 63.6 percent for all IBR offenses during the month of January.

### **Traffic Enforcement News:**

The department conducted DMV overtime enforcement on eight dates during the month of January. Four officers worked an additional 47.5 hours of overtime resulting in fifty-one (51) traffic stops, which yielded 41 summons and 10 warnings. All of the citations were for speed violations. This came at a cost of \$1,188.27, which is reimbursed through the grant.






