Department News:

March has become the traditional kickoff of the tourist season for the police department. The increase in events and activities signals the start of spring and the waves of visitors that accompany warmer weather.

Throughout the month of March, the police department participated in several activities and community events. Some of the highlights include:

- March 2nd: Lieutenant Holbrook and Chief Sullivan participated in Read Across America Day at Abingdon Elementary School.
- March 17th: The department spearheaded the traffic efforts for the Shamrock 4-miler. The fire department, recreation department and streets department were very instrumental in making this event a success.



March 18th: The department and the streets department assisted in moving a house for Habitat for Humanity. The house was moved in two sections from the Neff Center to Baltimore Street. It was good to



be able to work with Habitat for Humanity on this project.

- March 21st: The department participated in the annual statewide tornado drill. This included sounding of the tornado warning sirens, sending a test message through Alert Abingdon, and a mock preparedness exercise.
- March 29th: Officer Heath assisted Glade Spring Middle School with their 6th grade Leadership club. This included a Segway demonstration.

During the month of March the police department spent <u>60 hours</u> either waiting in the ER with ECO patients or in transport of TDO patients. This came at a <u>direct, unsubsidized, cost to the</u> <u>tax payers of \$1,934.15</u> for the month. This equates to \$241.777 per mental health event during the month of March.

School Resource Officers Report - March

Disciplinary Referrals:

During the month of March the School Resource Officers had several incidents that involved counseling of students for situations that were not criminal in nature but could evolve to be. With the officers taking proactive steps ahead of time, the issues are usually resolved before they turn criminal and require police or court intervention. Some of these incidents include:

Abingdon High School:

- Assault complaint
- Assist other agency
- Lost property
- Information request
- Possess tobacco (2)

E.B Stanley Middle School:

- Possess tobacco
- Intimidation
- Larceny complaint
- Welfare check (3)
- Information request

In addition to the referrals list for each school, each officer is responsible for daily security checks to ensure the security and safety of staff and students in the buildings on the campuses.

Calls for Service:

For the month of March the department responded to 345 calls for service. We were able to close all but 19 of those calls. This gave us an overall clearance rate of 94.4 percent for the month. The department responded to 29 IBR reportable cases in the month of March; at the conclusion of the month, 15 remained active. This resulted in a clearance rate of 48.2 percent for all IBR offenses during the month of March.

Traffic Enforcement News:

The department conducted DMV overtime enforcement on six dates during the month of March. Four officers worked an additional 34 hours of overtime resulting in thirty-two (32) traffic stops, which yielded 29 summons and 5 warnings. sixteen (16) citations were for speed violations, seven (7) were for inspection or registration violations, and six (6) were for other traffic violations. This came at a cost of \$879.16, which is reimbursed through the grant.






Citations By Officer - Officer Initiated March 2017
