Department News:

Falling leaves, brisk morning air, and crisp evenings (spent at high school stadiums) are my favorite things about fall. Another great thing about fall is that our call volume traditionally slows down. However, September always keeps us busy and this September was no exception.

We began the month with a rainy Labor Day weekend. The rain really held down the numbers for Buskerfest, which still took place on September 2nd. However, several people braved the rain to enjoy the walking tour of downtown and to watch some interesting entertainment.

On September 11th, the nation paused to remember the terrorist attack of 9-11-2001. Patriot's Day has become a time when people show their appreciation for police, fire, and EMS workers. We received a visit from the kind members of First Christian Church. They stopped by and left treats and cards of thanks for the staff.

September 10th marked the opening of the Washington County Fair. Throughout the week we provided traffic control in an attempt to reduce the congestion at the fair entrance.

On September 14th the local chapter of Mothers Against Drunk Driving held their annual recognition ceremony at the Higher Education Center. Officer Kayla Richardson was the recipient of the M.A.D.D. award for the Abingdon Police Department this year. She and over forty other officers from southwest Virginia were treated to dinner and music as a part of the ceremony. Each year over 10,000 Americans are killed by drunk or drug impaired drivers. However, M.A.D.D. seems to be the only







organization nationally that is concerned with reducing the number of deaths attributed to impaired driving through best practice enforcement. We greatly appreciate the efforts of M.A.D.D. and thank them for recognizing the officers who are truly making an impact.

From September 20th to the 22nd, the department provided traffic control each morning for the Call to Arms Celebration at the Muster Grounds. The weather was extremely cooperative for this event and all of the students in attendance seemed to enjoy the opportunity to walk through history.

September 26 5 hours of transport time -

During the month of September the police department spent <u>32 hours</u> either waiting in the ER with ECO patients or in transport of TDO patients. This came at a <u>direct, unsubsidized,</u> <u>cost to the tax payers of \$1,014.20</u> for the month. This equates to \$202.84 per mental health event during the month of September. Officers from the department traveled 648.2 miles in transport of mental health cases.

In order to have an understanding of how mental health cases affect the department and the taxpayers, I have developed the following chart to track the hours and total cost associated with mental health cases each month:

School Resource Officers Report - September

During the month of September the following are reportable offenses:

Abingdon High school:

Assault - 1 Miscellaneous call - 6 Dispute - 1 Drug Violation - 1

E.B. Stanley:

Miscellaneous - 1 DSS Referral - 2

During the month of September the following non-reportable incidents occurred at Abingdon High school or E.B. Stanley Middle school.

Officer Heath was advised by the Assistant principal Dr. Davis that a student had missed several days and was a truancy issue. She advised that she was unable to reach the student's mother by telephone and requested that I attempt to make contact at the student's home and have them contact her at the school.

Officer Heath was able to make contact with the student and his mother. Officer Heath spoke to the mother about her legal options since the student is 17 years old is refusing to attend school. She was advised to contact the school about the issue before a petition for truancy was filed by school officials.

Officer Heath was notified of a potential tobacco violation at Abingdon High school by the assistant principal, Dr. Davis. The item in question turned out to be electronic vaping device. The device contained liquid but there was no way determining if the liquid contained nicotine, which would be illegal to possess under the age of 18. The student was counseled about the use of such devices.

On 9/19 Officer Heath was advised the assistant principal, Dr. Austin advised that there were some students who sent some pictures that were inappropriate. The pictures were sent on Snapchat and determined to be inappropriate and not criminal nature. Officer Heath spoke to the students in front of Dr. Austin about the dangers of sending pictures of this nature. The school notified their parents as well.

Daily checks of doors and outside premises are performed at each school on a regular basis as well to ensure the security and safety of staff and students in the buildings.

Calls for Service:

For the month of September the department responded to 332 calls for service. We were able to close all but 13 of those calls. This gave us an overall clearance rate of 96.0 percent for the month. The department responded to 36 IBR reportable cases in the month of September; at the conclusion of the month, 9 remained active. This resulted in a clearance rate of 75.0 percent for all IBR offenses during the month of September.

Traffic Enforcement News:

The department conducted DMV overtime enforcement on three dates during the month of September. Three officers worked an additional 24 hours of overtime resulting in twenty-five (25) traffic stops, which yielded 22 summons and 7 warnings. Nine (9) citations were for speed violations, four (4) were for inspection violations, two (2) were registration violations, one (1) for an expired license, and 6 for non-moving violations. This came at a cost of \$563.81, which is reimbursed through the grant.

As always, I am eager to address any questions or concerns you may have concerning the operations of the police department.
