Department News:

On November 11th we assisted with traffic for the Veteran's Day ceremony at Veteran's Park. It was a great day for this event! The weather was very cooperative and the events were well attended.



On November 14th a new sign was installed at the police department. The original sign was put in place when the building was opened. The years of weather caused it to weather and crack. The new sign has more vibrant colors and a larger font size.



On November 16th our newest officer, Tanner Graham, graduated from the police academy. Officer Graham is now in field training preparing to patrol the streets by himself. In addition, I was honored to be asked by the class to address the graduating class. It was a pleasure to speak to the graduates and provide a few words of encouragement as they begin their careers.

Finally, throughout the month of November the department participated in our semi-annual firearms qualification. This training included qualifying with the issued pistol, shotgun, and rifle in daylight and nighttime conditions. In addition, the officers reviewed the use of force policy. We appreciate the efforts that were put forth by our firearms instructors: Officer Eades, Officer Carty, and Investigator Austin.

NONE THIS REPORTING PERIOD.

During the month of November the police department spent **47 hours** either waiting in the ER with ECO patients or in transport of TDO patients. This came at a **direct, unsubsidized, cost to the tax payers of \$1,882.96** for the month. This equates to \$376.59 per mental health event during the month of November. Officers from the department traveled 1,498.82 miles in transport of mental health cases for the month.

In order to have an understanding of how mental health cases affect the department and the taxpayers, I have developed the following chart to track the hours and total cost associated with mental health cases each month:

School Resource Officers Report - November

In the month of November the following are reportable offenses occurred at our schools :

Abingdon High School:

Tobacco Violation - 1

E.B. Stanley:

Assist other agency - 1

During the month of November the following non-reportable incidents occurred at Abingdon High school or E.B. Stanley Middle school.

November 1: SRO Debusk was advised that a Grandparent of a student attempted to leave money for their grandchild at the high school by placing the money in the student's car. They accidentally put the money in the wrong vehicle in the parking lot of the high school. Officer Debusk was able to locate the owner of the vehicle and get the money delivered to the correct student.

A student, who informed him that she was having problems with another student, approached SRO Debusk. After speaking with the student and Dr. Davis, they were able to resolve the problem.

November 9: Washington County Sheriff assisted SRO'S Debusk and Heath by utilizing Deputy Hinchey's K-9 for vehicle checks for illegal drugs. The K-9 alerted on several vehicles, which were searched, but only an underage possession of tobacco charge was issued. The drivers of all vehicles were advised of the consequences of having illegal items in their vehicle and about providing rides to friends, they know or believe to be in possession of such items. School administration contacted all parents of the students involved.

November 20: SRO Debusk was advised that there had been two fights while he was out of the building the week before. Officer Debusk was told that the school had already taken disciplinary measures, but he contacted the parents of the students and advised them of their right to pursue any charges for the assaults that had occurred. Both parties advised Officer Debusk that they were not interested in pursuing any charges.

Officer Debusk performed a Welfare check on a student who had missed several consecutive days of school. Upon speaking to the student, a courtesy ride to school was offered by Officer Debusk but was refused. Officer Debusk reported to the school administration who contacted DSS, and were going to seek help from Juvenile Court.

Daily checks of doors and outside premises are performed at each school on a regular basis as well to ensure the security and safety of staff and students in the buildings.

Calls for Service:

For the month of November the department responded to 303 calls for service. We were able to close all but 23 of those calls. This gave us an overall clearance rate of 92.4 percent for the month. The department responded to 33 IBR reportable cases in the month of November; at the conclusion of the month, 20 remained active. This resulted in a clearance rate of 39.3 percent for all IBR offenses during the month of November.

Traffic Enforcement News:

There was no grant enforcement during month of November. The grant for this fiscal year has expired.

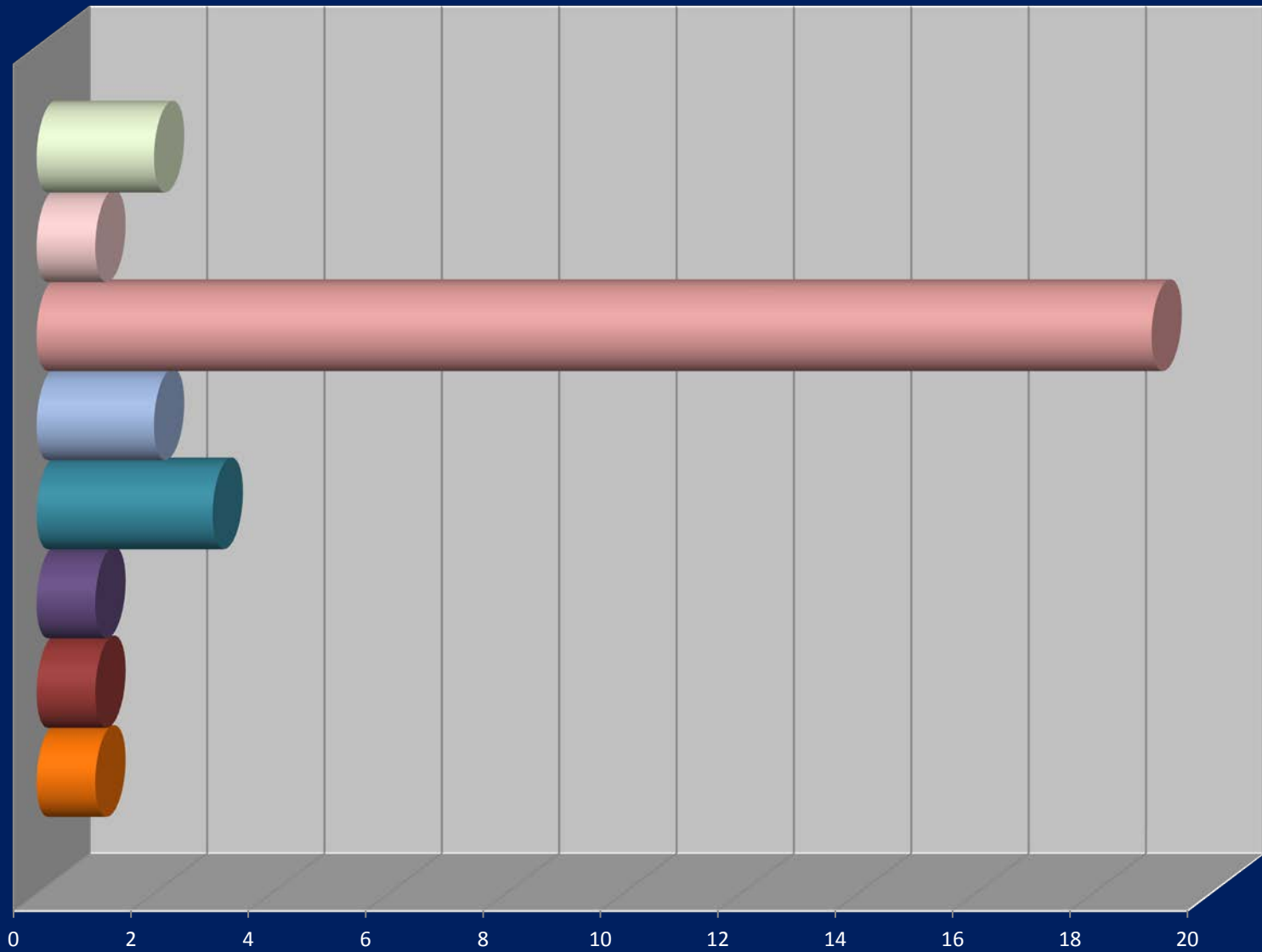

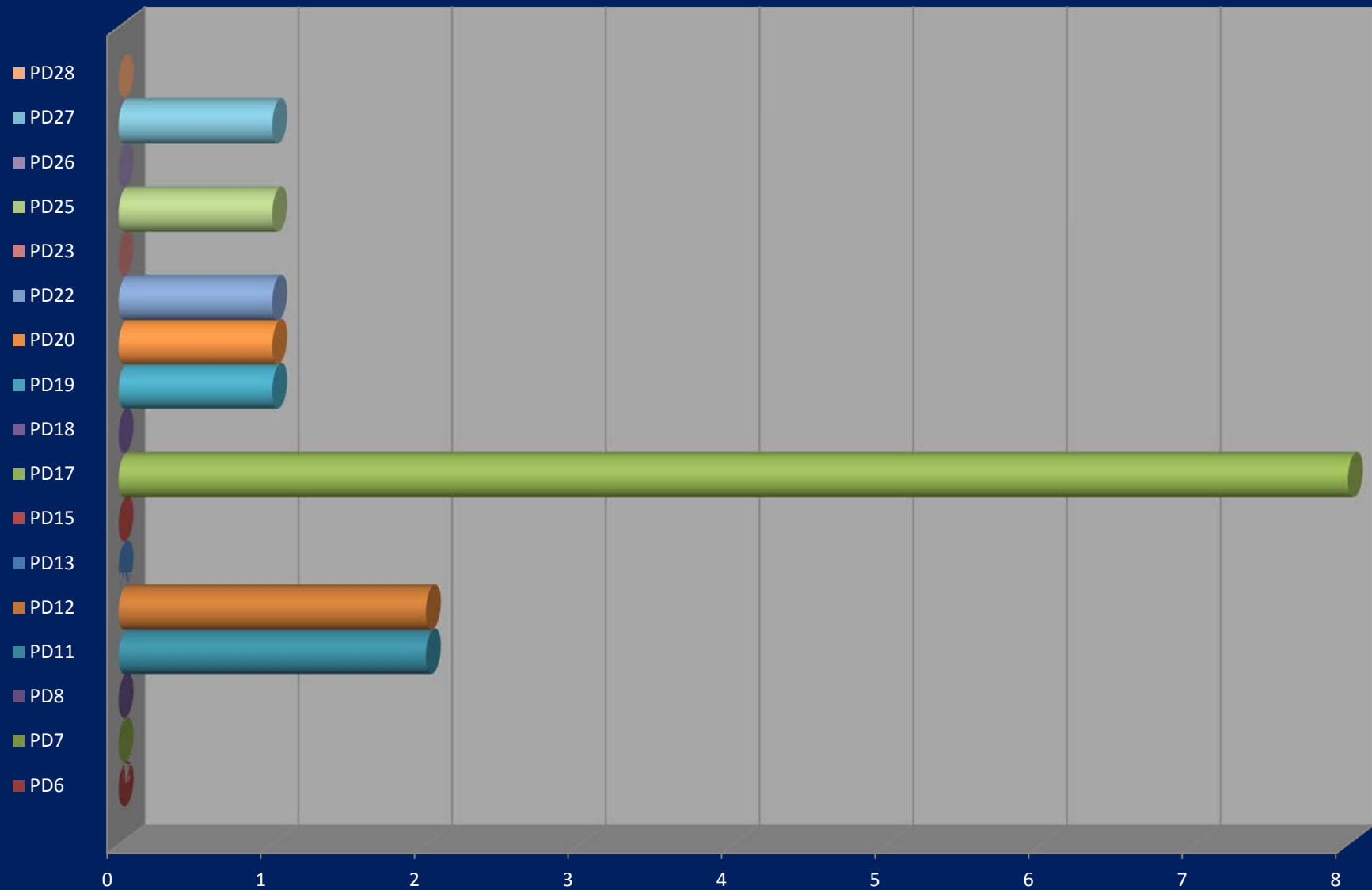

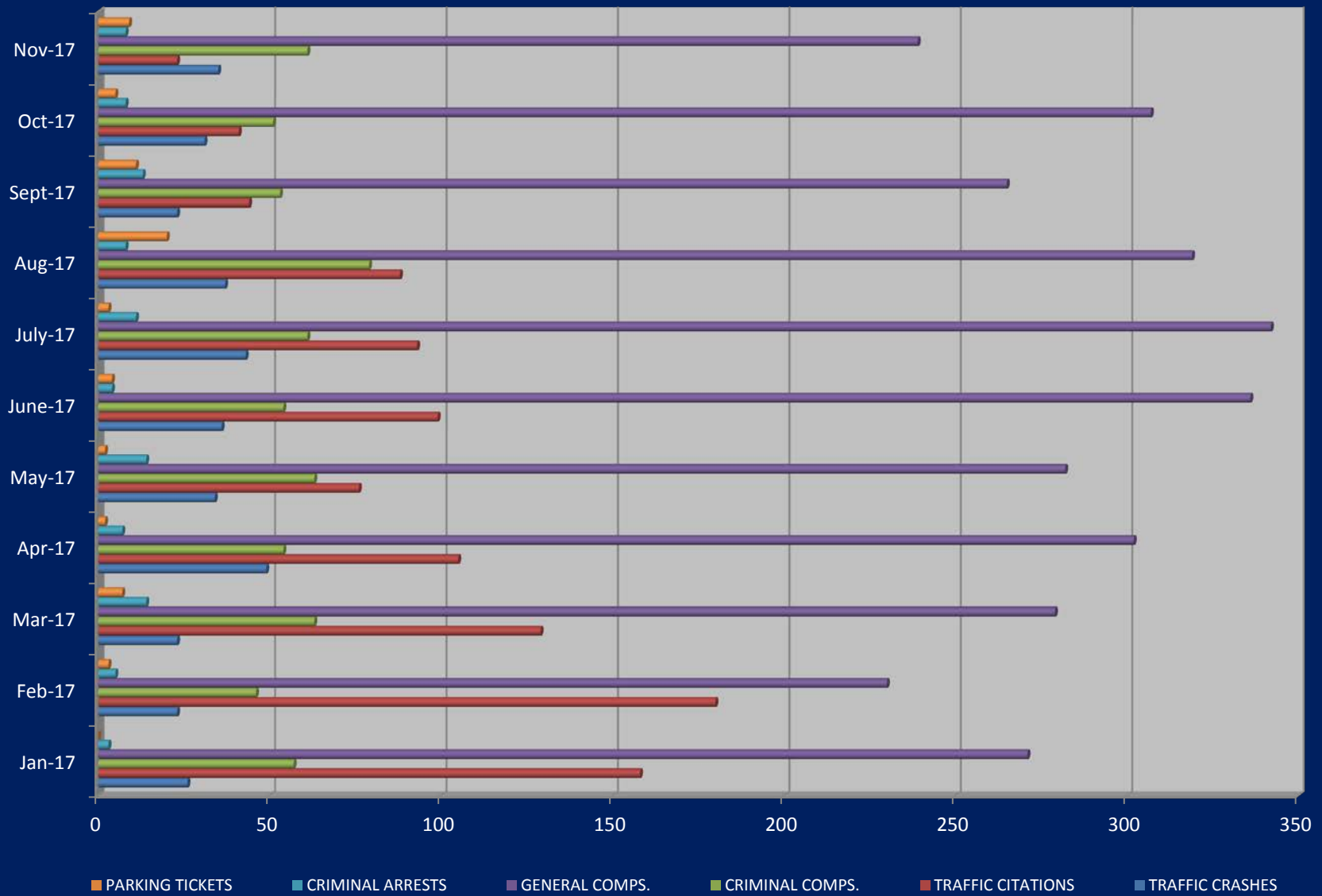

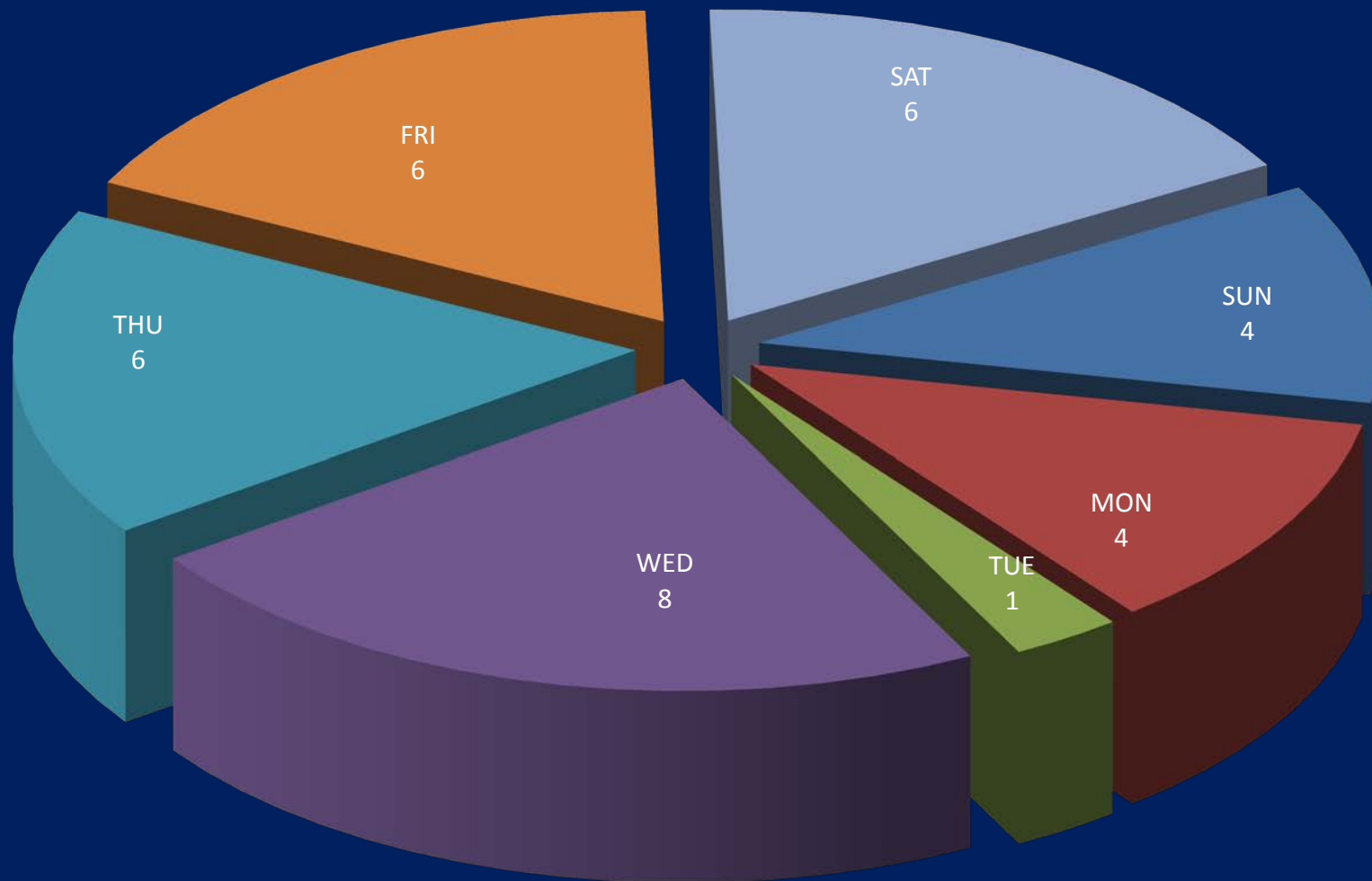
Citations By Officer - Officer Initiated November 2017
