

## **Department News**:



The events of major importance for the police in January were limited to two:

January 8th - The Town Council meeting was a formal opportunity to give our best wishes to those who retired and welcome those who were newly promoted. We were able to recognize Allen Hay, Charlie Overbay, and Bill Snodgrass for their service, and even snapped a photo of them with the Council.

#### NONE THIS REPORTING PERIOD

During the month of January the police department spent <u>61 hours</u> either waiting in the ER with ECO patients or in transport of TDO patients. This came at a <u>direct, unsubsidized, cost to the tax payers of</u> <u>\$1,423.19</u> for the month. This equates to \$237.19 per mental health event during the month of January. Officers from the department traveled 867 miles across the Commonwealth in transport of mental health cases during the month.

In order to have an understanding of how mental health cases affect the department and the taxpayers, I have developed the following chart to track the hours and total cost associated with mental health cases each month:

## **School Resource Officer Report**

During the month of January, the following reportable offenses occurred in our schools:

Abingdon High School Underage possession of Tobacco - 1 Assault - 2 Miscellaneous Call - 1 Hit and Run - 1 **E.B. Stanley Middle School** Miscellaneous Call - 5 Welfare Check - 1

During the month of January the following non-reportable incidents occurred at Abingdon High school or E.B. Stanley Middle school.

January 10th: SRO DeBusk was advised by the custodian that he caught a student smoking in school. Officer DeBusk reviewed the security video and identified a student in an area of the school that had no after school activities. The Principal and Officer DeBusk spoke with the student about the incident and the school took the necessary disciplinary action.

Officer DeBusk checked on a student who had been absent from school for numerous days. The school is now in the process of filing charges for excessive absences.

January 18th: Officer Heath spoke to a group of 6th grade students about the dangers of sending inappropriate images over social media apps or text messaging.

January 19th: Officer DeBusk defused a situation in the hallways of the school when he observed two students in a verbal altercation. Officer DeBusk spoke to both students about the incident and advised them to separate.

January 24th: Officer Heath was approached by a teacher about concerns of a student making inappropriate comments toward staff and others. The principal and Officer Heath spoke to this student about these comments and a referral was made to the guidance counselor and Highlands Community Services.

Daily checks of doors and outside premises are performed at each school on a regular basis as well to ensure the security and safety of staff and students in the buildings.

#### Calls for Service:

During the month of January the department responded to 322 calls for service. We were able to close all but 16 of those calls. This gave us an overall clearance rate of 95 percent for the month. The department responded to 27 IBR reportable cases in the month of January; at the conclusion of the month, 11 remained active. This resulted in a clearance rate of 59.25 percent for all IBR offenses during the month of January.

#### **Traffic Enforcement News:**

The department conducted DMV overtime enforcement on nine dates during the month of January. Six officers worked an additional 71 hours of overtime resulting in seventy (70) traffic stops, which yielded 62 summons and 20 warnings. Twenty-nine (29) citations were for speed violations, eighteen (18) were for inspection violations, five (5) were for OL/Suspended License, four (4) were for seatbelt violations, three (3) violations were for Registration Infractions, and three (3) were for non-moving violations. In addition to the traffic citations, officers also made one arrest as a result of the additional enforcement. This came at a cost of \$1,656.23, which is reimbursed through the grant.

As always, I am eager to address any questions or concerns you may have concerning the operations of the police department.




