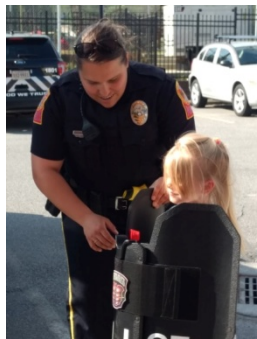

Department News:

May was a month of proactive policing at the Abingdon Police Department. Officers continued to engage community members through the community policing project that was initiated in April. Officers also conducted numerous traffic stops in our efforts focused on preventing traffic crashes and reduce crime rates. Thirteen offenders were arrested from these traffic stops and six of those arrests were for narcotic violations.



This month we welcomed back our new officers who have spent the last 19 weeks in basic police training. Officer Barker and Officer Roark did a fantastic job while in training at the academy but will not be certified until they complete their Field Training. This part of the training will require that they be teamed up with a certified Field Training Officer (FTO) who will guide them through their endeavor to becoming certified police officers.



As always we are happy to have visitors to the Abingdon Police Department. During this month we hosted the Girl Scout Troop 15. Officer Richardson gave them a tour of the building and showed them our vehicles and other equipment.

We are grateful to the United States Deputy Sheriff's Association for donating Emergency Belt Trauma Kits for all of our officers. Each kit contains a tourniquet, hemostatic dressing, cpr mask, and gloves. These kits will be used for emergency first aid needs for the officers or others until EMS arrives.

During the month of April the police department spent **25 hours** either waiting in the ER with ECO patients or in transport of TDO patients. This came at a **direct, unsubsidized, cost to the tax payers of \$681.48** for the month. This equates to \$113.58 per mental health event during the month of May. Officers from the department traveled **391.7** miles across the Commonwealth in transport of mental health cases during the month.

In order to have an understanding of how mental health cases affect the department and the taxpayers, I have developed the following chart to track the hours and total cost associated with mental health cases each month:

During the month of May the following **non-reportable** incidents occurred at Abingdon High school or E.B. Stanley Middle school.

May 1: Officer DeBusk gave a courtesy transport to a student who was being belligerent with teachers and staff. The student's parents were unable to come to the school, so for the well being of all involved and to keep from further disruptions, Officer DeBusk took the student home.

May 3: Officer DeBusk was notified by a student that she had a flat tire in the parking lot. Officer DeBusk and a coach from the High School changed the flat tire for the student.

Officer Heath was notified of an altercation that occurred between two 7th grade students in the cafeteria. No injuries were reported and the issue was handled by the school administration.

May 7: Officer Heath spoke with students who were reported to have been involved in an altercation. The students were advised by Officer Heath and school administration of the consequences and Officer Heath increased the check of that area of the school due to ongoing issues.

May 10: Officer DeBusk performed a truancy home visit on behalf of the school.

May 17: Officer Heath was notified about a student being in possession of a pocket knife. The knife was found to be under three inches in length and it was determined that there was no intent to commit any wrong doing by the student. Disciplinary action was taken and the parent was notified to pick up the student.

May 22: Officer DeBusk performed a home visit at the request of a parent who was concerned that her daughter may not graduate. The student was located and advised about what she needed to do academically to graduate.

Officer Heath assisted with the 8th grade graduation and following dance that took place at Abingdon High School. Over 200 students graduated and will be moving on to high school.

May 25: (Last day of school) Officer DeBusk and Officer Heath attended the Abingdon High School graduation. While at the ceremony, they assisted a fall victim until they could be transported by the life saving crew.

Calls for Service:

During the month of May the department responded to 366 calls for service. We were able to close all but 22 of those calls. This gave us an overall clearance rate of 93.9 percent for the month. The department responded to 44 IBR reportable cases during the month; at the conclusion of the month, 13 remained active. This resulted in a clearance rate of 70.5 percent for all IBR offenses during the month of May.

Traffic Enforcement News:

As mentioned in the cover letter the Patrol Division was very active in traffic enforcement during the month of May. 73 citations were issued for violations that did not involve traffic crashes. During these traffic stops, officers made 13 arrests. Of those arrests officers had six narcotic violations.

Special Events:

The department scheduled officers to work the following events:

May 24: Thursday Night Jam - 2 Officers

May 26: Plumb Alley Day - 10 Officers

May 28: Memorial Day Service - 1 Officer

May 31: Thursday Night Jam - 2 Officers

Officers were scheduled to work the Thursday Night Jam on May 17, however it was moved due to weather to a location that did not require a road closure.

Other Notable Events:

Various other activities and events took place at the Abingdon Police Department during this month to include the following:

May 10: Girl Scout Troop 15 visited the Abingdon Police Department. Officer Richardson provided them with a tour of the building and of police vehicles.

May 13-19: National Police Week. Officers were provided lunch and other desserts throughout the week.

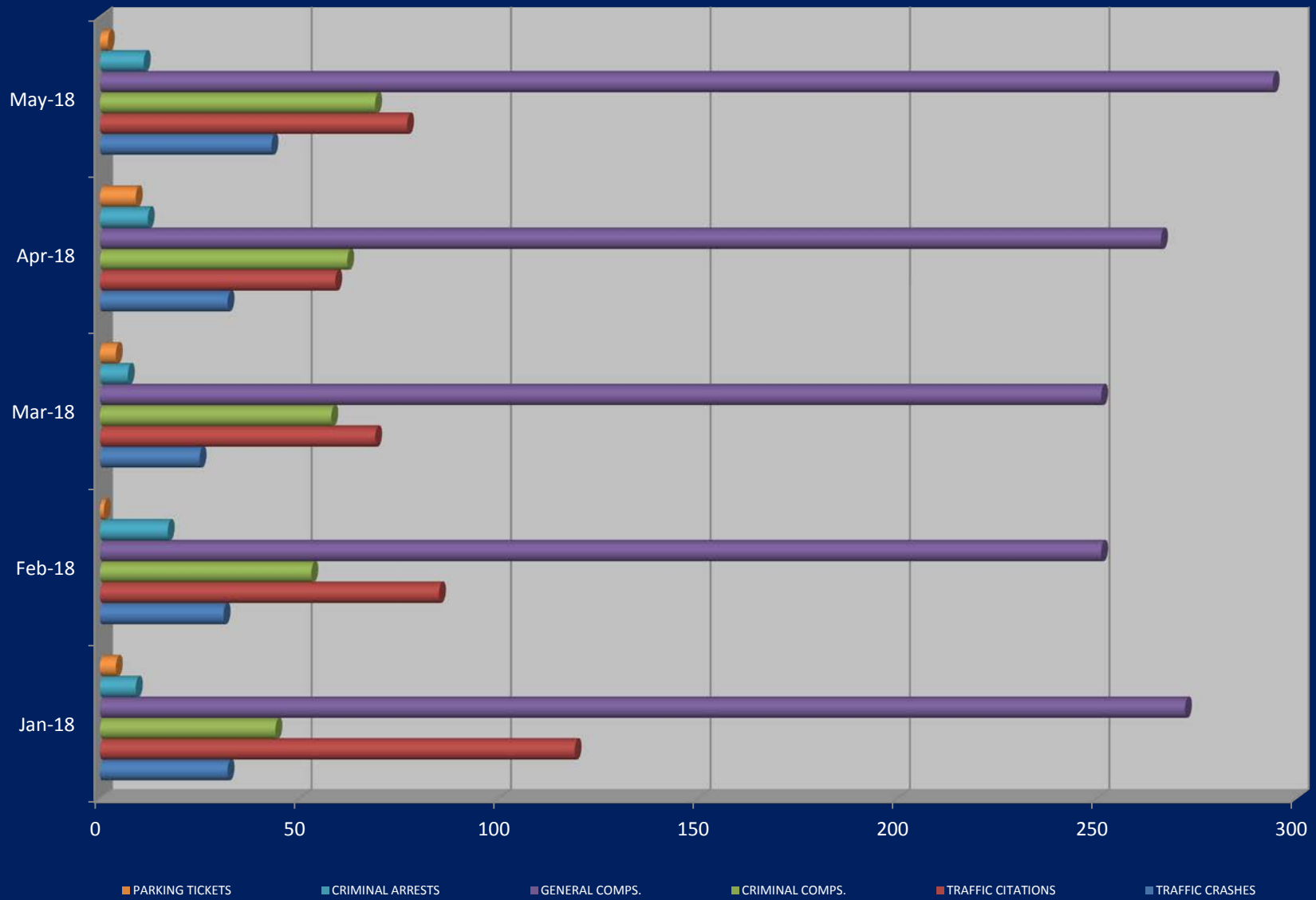

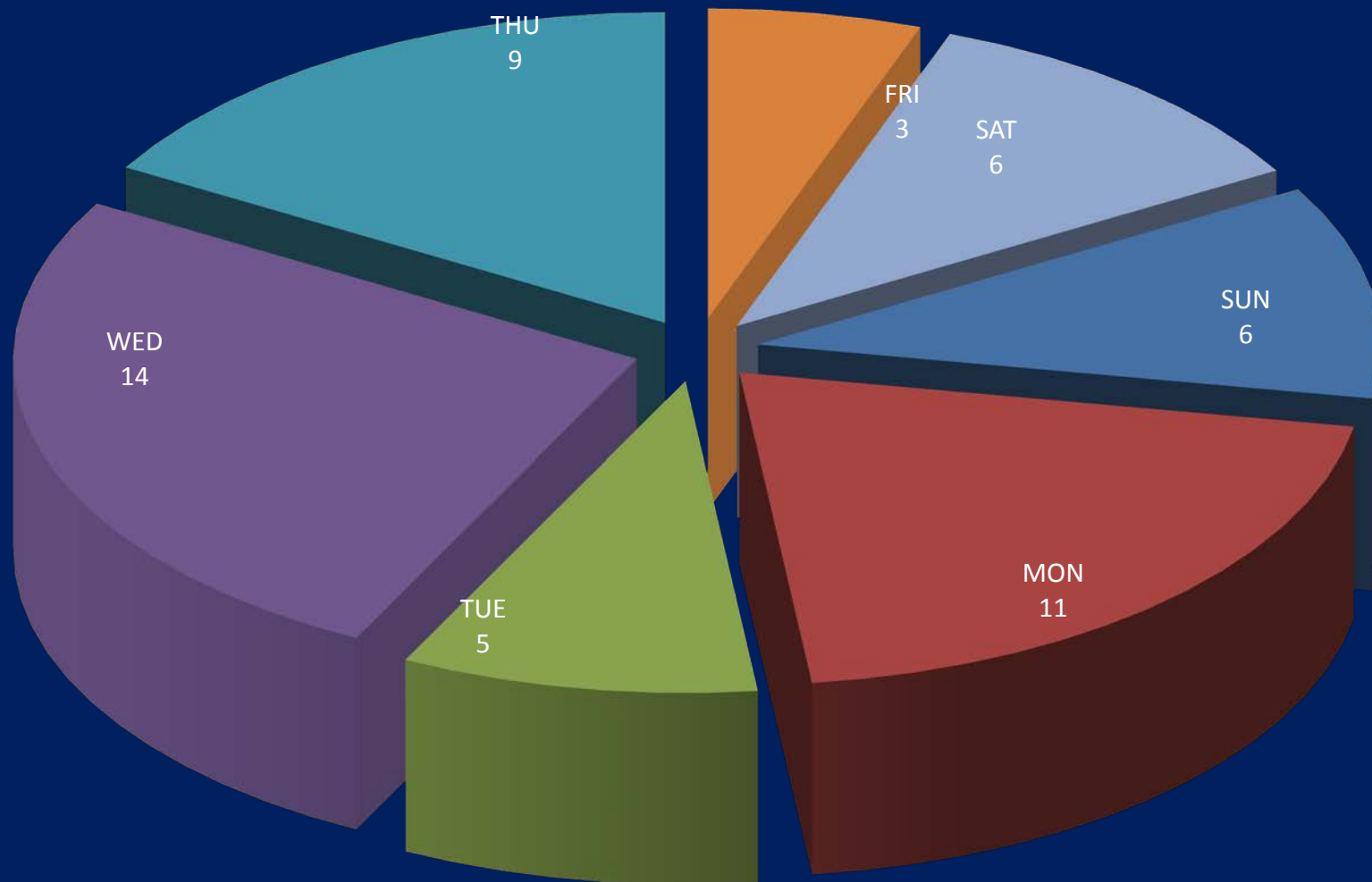

Call Volume Monthly Comparison

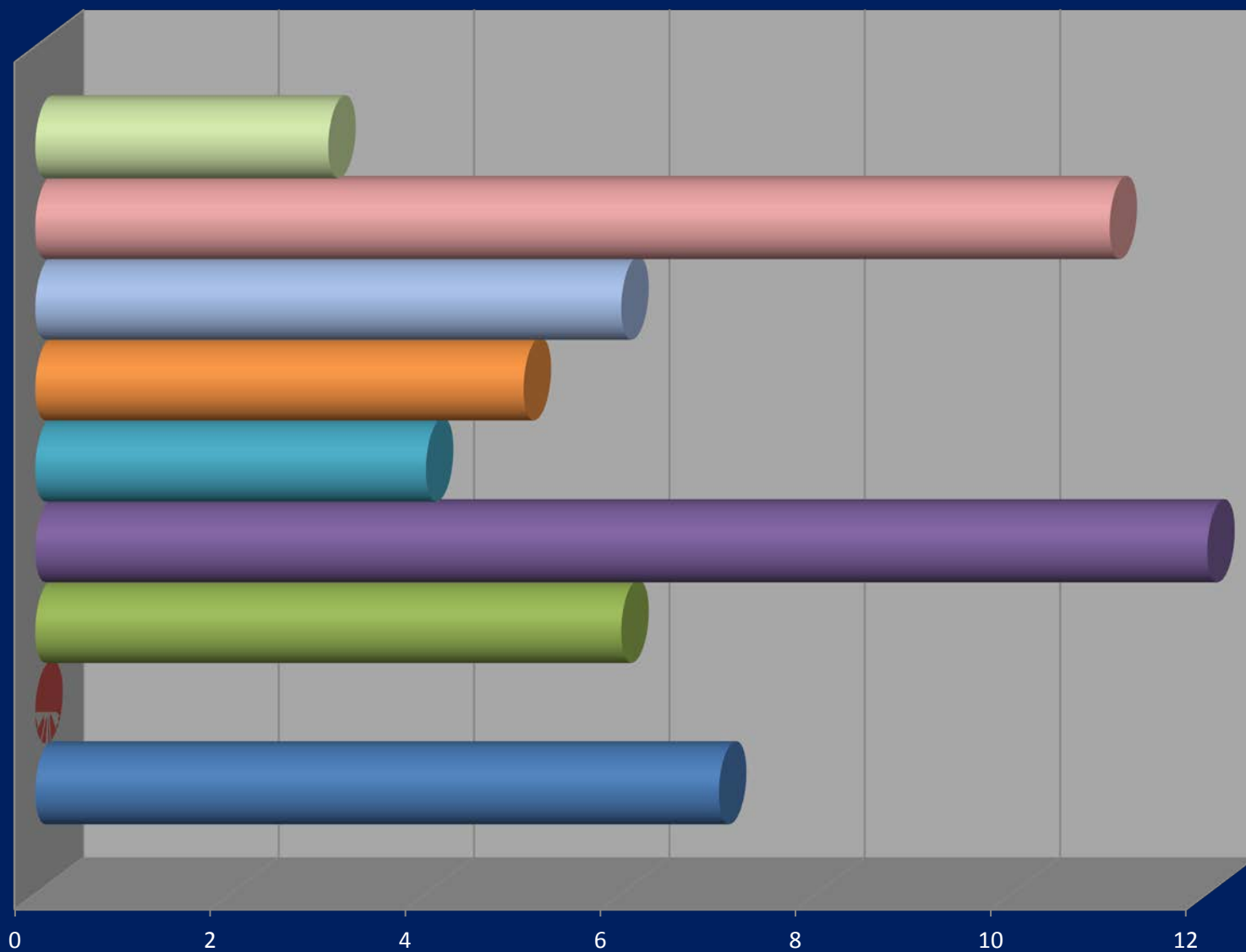


Group I Offenses by Day of the Week May 2018
