**G. PETITIONS, PUBLIC HEARINGS, AND FIRST READING OF ORDINANCES**

**1. PUBLIC HEARING – First Reading – Enactment Ordinance of the Council of the Town of Abingdon, Virginia Chapter 18 – Businesses – Article II – Licenses, Sections 18-35 to 18-40 – Homestay Ordinance (VIDEO 12:38 – 22:00)**

Greg Kelly, Town Manager reported that this matter was before Council for first reading and consideration of a Homestay ordinance. The proposed Ordinance requires residents that use the platforms such as AirBnB be required to obtain a business license and pay lodging taxes to the town. Mr. Kelly noted that the Ordinance also requires that properties advertised as AirBnB's be subject to inspection by the town's building department and fire department.

Mayor Lowe read a portion of the Ordinance and then declared the public hearing open. Hearing no comments from the public, Mayor Lowe closed the public hearing.

**On motion by Mr. Howard, seconded by Mr. Craig, the Council adopted the Ordinance of the Town of Abingdon, Virginia Chapter 18 – Businesses – Article II – Licenses, Sections 18-35 to 18-40 – Homestay Ordinance on first reading hereby dispensing with the second reading and to be effective on August 10, 2017.**

**Mr. Humphreys stated that he had a personal interest in a transaction as far as COIA is concerned and certified the following: "If a group of 3 or more & council member or employee is in that group, he or she may participate upon certifying that he or she is "able to participate the transaction fairly, objectively, and in the public interest. Section 2.2-3112(A)(2), 3115(H)"**

## **H. SECOND READINGS**

**1.Second Reading – Ordinance of the Council of the Town of Abingdon, Virginia proposing a Real Property Tax Increase for the Fiscal Year 2017-2018 (VIDEO 22:04 – 23:45)**

Greg Kelly, Town Manager, stated that this is a second reading of the Ordinance proposing a real property tax increase. Mr. Kelly noted that the public hearing was held last month at the regular Council meeting. Mr. Kelly noted that this is not an actual tax rate increase but an increase in tax revenue will result from a real estate assessment increase and anytime that occurs the Council has to enact an ordinance. Mr. Kelly commented that the tax assessments of real property are handled by Washington County.

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## **I. CONSIDERATION OF BIDS**

- 1. Consideration of purchase of Hyper-Converged Server/Storage upgrade and authorization of Town Manager to execute loan documents with First Bank and Trust in the amount of \$192,000. (VIDEO 23:52 – 35:30)**

Floyd Bailey, Director of IT, reported to Council that the town is facing an ever increasing requirement for the retention of documents, video, emails, etc. and that storage space is very low. Mr. Bailey advised that the storage capacity for the town needed to be upgraded to accommodate the volume of information the town is required to maintain. Mr. Bailey noted that the town's banking institution, First Bank and Trust, had provided a quote of .45% loan rate on the amount of \$192,000. Mr. Bailey noted that the equipment would be purchased on state contract and the first loan payment would not be due until after July 1, 2018 and be for a term of 5 years.

Ms. Patterson inquired about storage in Dropbox and where videos would be stored by the town.

Mr. Humphreys inquired if this loan could be authorized by Council noting that it will encumber future Council's.

**On motion by Mr. Howard, seconded by Mr. Craig, the Council authorized the Town Manager to enter into an agreement to purchase the Hyper-Converged Server/Storage upgrade and further authorized the Town Manager to execute said loan documents with First Bank and Trust in the amount of \$192,000.**

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## **J. REPORTS FROM THE TOWN MANAGER/ASSISTANT TOWN MANAGER**

### **1. Consideration of appropriation of \$5,000 to Overmountain Victory Trail Association for the support and development of a Master Plan for the OVNHT from Abingdon, Virginia to Elizabethton, TN. (VIDEO 35:38 – 40:04)**

Greg Kelly, Town Manager, reported that Matthew Johnson, former Director of Planning, had reported in early 2016 that various localities along the trail from Abingdon to Elizabethton were being asked to contribute the amount \$5,000 toward the development of OVNHT master plan. No appropriation was made at that time and it is back on the agenda now for consideration. Mr. Humphreys stated that this would serve routes to travel, including biking and walking trails, between Abingdon and Elizabethton, TN.

**On motion by Mr. Humphreys, seconded by Mr. Howard, to approve the Town Manager to enter into an agreement to purchase the Hyper-Converged Server/Storage upgrade and authorize the Town Manager to execute said loan documents with First Bank and Trust in the amount of \$192,000.**

### **2. Consideration of appropriation for the Abingdon Muster Ground music group. (VIDEO 40:28 – 54:26)**

Michael Henningson, representative of the Abingdon Muster Grounds music group addressed the Council stating the fife and drum group has ten members and are requesting an appropriation from Council. Mr. Henningson noted that the funding would be used to grow the group, secure insurance and rent a place to rehearse and

store instruments. Mr. Henningson commented that the group has performed at Plumb Alley Day, events held at the Muster Grounds and also at the Sinking Spring Cemetery.

**On motion by Mr. Humphreys, seconded by Mrs. Patterson, the Council approved an appropriation of \$2,000 from the Council contingency to fund the Abingdon Muster Ground music group.**

Mr. Humphreys commented that he had secured funds for the group to purchase uniforms. Council member Patterson handed Mr. Henningsen cash as a donation to be used for the groups expenses.

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**3. Consideration of adoption of revised bylaws for Tourism Advisory Committee (VIDEO 54:35 - 58:28)**

Jayne Duehring, Director of Tourism, reported that the Tourism Advisory Committee served as an official channel of information between the retailers, restaurants, B's&B's, hotels, attractions, museums, and historic facilities to stay up to date on trends and cooperative efforts. The composition of members has been discussed and the committee recommends removing the representative from Heartwood; change a member from the Virginia Higher Education Center to any higher education facility; representatives from Abingdon Main Street and the Washington County Chamber of Commerce from *ex officio* to voting members. The remaining *ex officio* members would not have a voting rights, which includes an Abingdon Town Council member and a representative from one of the 2 districts that serve Abingdon on the Washington County Board of Supervisors.

**L. OLD BUSINESS OR MATTERS NOT COVERED AT WORK SESSION (VIDEO 58:33 – 1:04:56)**

Mr. Humphreys commented that Council's earlier decision to put out an RFP for ground penetrating radar on The Meadows property was no longer necessary as the Department of Historic Resources, as part of the permitting process through the Army Corps of Engineers, had evaluated the report from S&ME and had accepted the report as submitted. Mr. Humphreys noted that DHR was the state agency "gold standard" for evaluating historical and archaeological areas in the Commonwealth.

*At this time, Mr. Humphreys moved that the Council rescind its prior request for an RFP relative to ground penetrating radar on The Meadows site. Mr. Howard seconded the motion.*

Greg Kelly, Town Manager, stated that the permit is issued through the Army Corp of Engineers and Department of Environmental Quality.

Mr. Craig commented that no one had been allowed on the site and asked that the matter be left open until the final letter from DHR was received.

Ms. Patterson commented that Ms. Shearer and her group would go on the property, at no cost, and evaluate to see if there are unmarked grave sites.

Mr. Humphreys noted that he wished to amend his motion.

**Mr. Humphreys moved that the Council rescind its prior request for an RFP for ground penetrating radar relative to The Meadows site contingent upon the issuance of the permit by the Corp of Civil Engineers and upon recommendation by the Department of Historic Resources.**

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At this time, Mayor Lowe declared citizen David Lowe out of order and he was removed from the Council Chambers.

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**M. APPOINTMENTS TO BOARDS AND COMMITTEES (VIDEO 1:06:14 – 1:12:43)**

**- Appointment to the Virginia Highlands Small Business Incubator**

Mrs. Patterson stated that the Council had not been provided applications for any of the citizens applying for the Incubator Board. Mrs. Patterson suggested that Council not go into closed session at this time. Mayor Lowe stated that the matrix was accurate and the applications were in the previous Council packets during the months in which they were submitted. Ms. Rosenbaum noted that Ms. Patterson was not on Council when the applications would have been included in a Council packet and would provide those for the next meeting.

At this time, **Mr. Humphreys moved that Council appoint Ramsey White to serve on the Planning Commission. The motion died for lack of second.**

Mr. Humphreys stated that Mr. White already has his planning certification and would not require further training.

Mr. Howard stated that he did not think all Council members had seen all the applications.

Mr. Craig stated that he thought all members needed additional time to study the applications submitted.

Mrs. Patterson stated that the Town had \$1,000 put aside for training and questioned how much it would cost for Mr. Jett and Mr. Elmore to attend the Certified Planning Commissioner Training.

Mr. Craig stated that he had reimbursed the Town for his Planning Commissioner training at a figure of \$1,300.

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**N. Council Member Reports (VIDEO 1:12:48 – 1:37:40)**

Mr. Craig stated that he had become aware of a situation involving Council member Patterson and he had prepared a review of the situation he wished to share with those present. Mr. Craig read his statement and indicated he wished to make a motion.

**Mr. Craig made a motion that his report be accepted by Council, filed and be made a part of the minutes. Ms. Patterson seconded the motion.**

Discussion ensued among Council members and Mayor Lowe asked the Clerk to call the roll.


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Mr. Howard commented on his 32 years of service on the Council and how difficult the last year had been for him as a Council member.

## **Press Release – July 10, 2017**

### **For immediate release from**

**Mary C. “Cindy” Patterson, Abingdon, VA Town Councilwoman**

Circuit Court Judge Sage Johnson has recently informed me of an attempt by three Town Council Members – Mayor Cathy Lowe, Vice Mayor Rick Humphreys and Councilman Bob Howard to secretly communicate with the circuit court in an attempt to discredit me. The three Council members instructed Town Attorney Deborah Icenhour to dig up personal details of my divorce proceedings as part of that effort. Then, at the direction of the three council members, the Town Attorney put her findings in a letter that she sent to the Court. In her letter, the Town Attorney also invited the Court to contact her ex parte if the Court had any questions.

I am providing a copy of those written communications to the press.

Attachment 1 of Deborah Icenhour’s letter, which is included in your package, makes clear that the attempt to influence the judge was the result of a secret collaboration of the three town council members purporting to take an official action of the Town Council. I was kept in the dark about this, as was Councilman Wayne Craig. In fact, I was not made aware of their actions until Judge Johnson sent me a copy of his response. And obviously the public was also kept in the dark about this.

These actions by the three members of the Abingdon Town Council represent an underhanded personal attack on me that violates the Council's Code of Ethics. More importantly, the actions of the three council members constitute an egregious violation of the open meetings provisions of the Virginia Freedom of Information Act and were therefore illegal. These violations are yet another instance of the back room deals that have plagued Abingdon government in recent years. Wayne Craig and I ran, and were elected, on a platform of ridding Abingdon of these back room deals and the resulting corruption.

I will not be deterred by this vicious, personal attack from what I was elected to do. I want the citizens of Abingdon to know that I will not be intimidated by this and that I, along with fellow councilman Wayne Craig, will continue to fight for open and honest government for the citizens of Abingdon.

Dear Judge Simmons:

I am writing to you on behalf of three (3) of the Council members elected to serve the Town of Abingdon, Virginia (3 of 5 members, letter of request attached hereto, Exhibit 1). The Council requested that I contact you and convey issues of concern which are apparently arising in part from Ms. Patterson's personal life but have increasingly impacted her ability to perform her duties professionally as an elected Council member. These concerns continue to have adverse effects upon the other Council members, appointees and staff and conducting town business. The Exhibits attached hereto are included for clarification.

On behalf of Mayor Lowe, Vice Mayor Humphreys and Councilman Howard I humbly request your aide and guidance with regard to the above referenced Council member pursuant to the following issues/concerns set forth below:

- Conflict of Interest Act, Section 2.2- 3100, (Exhibit 2);
- Refusal to sign the Town of Abingdon's adopted Code of Ethics, (Exhibit 3, see highlighted sections, and Exhibit 4, the March 1, 2010 minutes of the regular Council meeting during which the Code of Ethics was adopted);
- Oath of Office dated June 20, 2016 for M. Cindy Patterson (Exhibit 4);
- Minutes of work session/regular meeting of March 6, 2017 regarding online placement of petitions opposing development (Exhibit 6 & 7). During this meeting Ms. Patterson exhibited a great deal of hostility toward the appointees, especially the legal department.
- Incident Report of May 3, 2017 involving M. Cindy Patterson and a civil dispute at 410 Green Spring Road, Abingdon, Virginia (Exhibit 8);
- Emergency Protective Order – Family Abuse filed May 4, 2017 by James A. Patterson (Exhibit 9) no surrender of concealed weapons permit as of 5/23/2017 per Circuit Court Clerk's Office;

- Page 3 of 9 from a marital property settlement by and between the Pattersons (Exhibit 10);
- Incident Report of May 4, 2017 involving Cindy M. Hockett Patterson (Exhibit 11);
- Preliminary Protective Order – Family Abuse filed May 8, 2017 by James Alvin Patterson, estranged husband of Cindy Patterson (Exhibit 12), no surrender of concealed weapons permit as of 5/23/2017. Mr. Patterson was awarded a 2-yr. Protective Order in the J & DR Court of Washington County, Virginia;
- Commonwealth of Virginia v. Mary C. Patterson – Adult Arraignment/Appointment of Counsel dated May 15, 2017 – violation of Section 18.2-57.2, Code of Virginia, assault and battery James A. Patterson who is a family or household member, Class 1 Misdemeanor (Exhibit 13);
- Applicable Code of Virginia sections (Exhibit 14).

While the type of conduct described herein has worsened and intensified with progressing legal issues, the tension has existed from the onset of Ms. Patterson's tenure in office. I have included the July 29, 2016 opinion from Washington County Commonwealth's Attorney, Josh Cumbow, pursuant to the Code of Virginia, 1950, as amended, §2.2-3126(B), a copy of which is included for your perusal.


One of the facts that has given Council members a great deal of concern is that we have learned from Mr. Patterson's written statement included in his request for a Protective Order on May 4 & 8, 2017, that Ms. Patterson has firearms and holds a concealed weapons permit (CWP). As of today, May 23, 2017, Ms. Patterson has not relinquished her CWP to the Washington County Circuit Court Clerk's Office as required pursuant to §18.2-308.1:4.

Further, the Code of Virginia, 1950, as amended, §24.2-233-235 states the process by which elected officials can be removed from their positions for "neglect of duty, misuse of office, or incompetence in the performance of duties when the neglect of duty, misuse of office, or incompetence in the performance of duties has a material adverse effect upon the conduct of the office."

The Council members named above have requested that I convey to you their concerns for safety and well-being of appointees, staff, residents and visitors as well as themselves. Having expressed such concerns and feelings of apprehension during Council meetings and work sessions, we submit our plea and seek your aide and guidance in best addressing this situation so that we may resume the transaction of the public business in the Town of Abingdon, Virginia.

If the Court should have questions with regard to this request, please do not hesitate to contact our offices. We are happy to supplement or assist as you see fit.


