Mr. Trotman updated Council on the U. S. Treasury's final guidance for lost revenue as of January 6, 2022. He explained the changes to calculation, stating the Town could now use the standard allowance for government services. Mr. Trotman said the tranche can be used for immediate needs within the project as long as the money is spent by 2026. He advised that from the \$4.0 million received on June 30, 2021, \$1.7 million expended, and receipt of the second tranche by the end of June or first of July, 2022.

Mr. Morani stated that in approaching the trestle repairs identified as a priority with the ARPA funds, Mr. Bell recommended that we delineate our responsibilities on these capital improvements. After discussions, it was determined to draft an agreement with the Town of Damascus to allow the Town of Abingdon to improve with coordination. Mr. Morani stated an RFP was issued for engineering services for some work strictly related to the trestle repairs identified, with No. 4 being the most pressing. Mr. Morani advised that Mr. Bell has spoken with the Town of Damascus' legal counsel, and they will be adopting the MOU at their next meeting. Mr. Morani noted there would be a more expansive MOU dealing with the maintenance of the trail at a later date.

ZONE TEXT AMENDMENT REQUEST:

United Way of Virginia made a request to the Planning and Zoning Commission on January 24, 2022 to allow for the expansion of Child Care Facilities into the B-1 and B-2 Zoning Districts. As child care has become one of the number one limiting factors in the rebuilding of the workforce during the covid pandemic there is a push for more child care facilities throughout the zoning districts. These facilities stretch beyond "home daycares" and are focused on the integration of workplaces and child care in close proximity. B-2 was initially asked by United Way to allow Child Care Facilities but during January 2022 meeting B-1 was added to the motion of the Planning Commission.

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE ZONING REGULATION:

Changes to the regulations can be found in the attached document (Exhibit B) and as shown below (deletions shown as strikethrough, additions shown as underline).

§ 10-1**Permitted uses by right.**

[Ord. of 4-6-2009, eff. 5-6-2009]

The following uses shall be permitted by right in the B-1 limited business district:

- 10-1-1. Single-family and two-family dwellings with area regulations, setback regulations, frontage regulations, yard regulations and height regulations as required in Article 6 of this ordinance.

FINDINGS:

Per Code of Virginia 15.2-2283 the purpose of zoning ordinance shall promote health, safety or general welfare of the public. Therefore, requiring that a zone text amendment be reviewed for several specific items.

• Whether and the extent to which the proposed amendment is consistent with the comprehensive plan and any other applicable and adopted long range planning documents;

Staff Findings: The Abingdon Comprehensive Plan was updated in 2020. There are specific references to the wellbeing of children within the Town. Expanding the child care facilities within the Town is supported through the Comprehensive Plan.

 Whether the proposed amendment is in conflict with any provision of the Zoning Ordinance and any other regulations contained in the Town Code or other applicable regulations;

<u>Staff Findings:</u> The B-1 and B-2 Districts support a wide range of uses including schools. While a day care facility functions differently than a school, the impact of both are often similar. Child drop off, pick up, peak usage times, parking requirements and traffic. Therefore, staff concludes that both uses will have similar impacts and are not in conflict to the provisions of the Zoning Ordinance.

• Whether and the extent to which there are changed conditions that require an amendment;

Staff Findings: The interpretation of the zoning regulation is that it identifies permitted uses and those not identified are not permitted. In the case of day care facility, it is required.

• Whether and the extent to which the proposed amendment addresses a demonstrated community need;

Staff Findings: The original impetus for the initiative by the Planning Commission was at the request of the United Way of Virginia. As they are key leaders in the growth of child care opportunities they indicated there was a need for additional facilities and yet, the zoning ordinance did not allow. There is a community need.

• Whether and the extent to which the proposed amendment would result in a logical and orderly development pattern;

<u>Staff Findings:</u> The B-1 and B-2 Districts support a wide range of uses. Allowing for child care facilities will not alter the orderly development patterns.

• Whether and the extent to which the proposed amendment would result in significantly adverse impacts on the natural environment, including but not limited to water, air, noise, storm water management, wildlife, vegetation, floodplains, wetlands, and the natural functioning of the environment; and

<u>Staff Findings:</u> The B-1 and B-2 Districts support a wide range of uses. The will be no adverse impacts to the natural environment with the zone text amendment. Site plan review, permitting and construction review will allow for each project to be reviewed for specific impacts.

• Whether and the extent to which the proposed amendment will have a positive effect on the balance between residential and nonresidential uses.

<u>Staff Findings:</u> The B-1 and B-2 Districts support a wide range of uses. Allowing for child care facilities in these districts will continue to support a balance between residential and nonresidential uses.

PLANNING COMMISSION:

The Planning Commission reviewed and initiated the request on January 24, 2022. They made their motion on this request on February 28, 2022. The final motion will be entered into the record on March 7, 2022 prior to the vote by the Town Council.

SAMPLE MOTION OF THE TOWN COUNCIL:


