In 2021 staff learned of a grant for the revitalization of aging shopping centers, industrial buildings and dilapidated structures. The grant is called the Industrial Revitalization Fund managed through the Virginia Department of Housing and Community Development. We contacted a variety of organizations, that we currently know are actively looking at locations for development or are in the process of proposing the redevelopment of structures. We indicated that the money was available and that we'd be willing to partner to bring more resources to our community.

The United Way replied to our request and said "yes we would be interested in applying for the grant and working with the Town of Abingdon".

A brief summary of the project they are proposing:

- 1. Regional headquarters for the United Way
- 2. Distribution center for childcare facility supplies and infrastructure
- 3. A childcare facility
- 4. A training center for the establishment of new and expanding childcare facilities in the region
- 5. Regional youth workforce development facility

As we are all aware childcare has become a critical piece in the redevelopment of the community post COVID. Staff believes that supporting this opportunity is a strong message of dedication to the post pandemic recovery.

Our role as the Town Staff, in this situation, would be to assist in the application and minimal management of the grant funding. In our discussions with DHCD they indicated that they could establish a direct contract with the United Way if we were awarded the grant.

### The Town would **not**:

- 1. Act as a fiscal agent
- 2. Act as a day to day manager of the grant
- 3. Provide a monetary match

A memorandum of understanding (MOU) will need to be established. This will protect both the Town and the United Way to ensure both participants understand the roles and responsibilities.

Staff is now asking the Town Council to adopt a resolution committing the Town to Applying for the IRF Grant on behalf of the United Way of Southwest Virginia.



## A RESOLUTION FOR THE TOWN OF ABINGDON, VIRGINIA APPROVING THE APPLICATION FOR INDUSTRIAL REVITALIZATION FUNDS

**WHEREAS**, the United Way of Southwest Virginia has requested that the Town of Abingdon assist in the application for the Industrial Revitalization Funds; and

**WHEREAS**, the United Way of Southwest Virginia is proposing to utilize the funds for the creation of a Regional Childcare Headquarters; and

WHEREAS, the projected redevelopment funds of \$5,000,000 are being requested; and

**WHEREAS**, the total number of beneficiaries is twenty-one counties and cities in Virginia, including a population of more than 1,000,000 who will benefit from this project; and

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** by the Council for the Town of Abingdon approves application partnership between the Town of Abingdon and the United Way of Southwest Virginia. The Council adopts said Resolution this twenty-third day of June 2022.

### **Bid Analysis**

From our analysis of the bids Anglers, LLC and Boring Contractors, Inc. are responsive bidders while Curtis Contracting, Inc. does not appear to be responsive. The non-responsive determination is based on 1) the evidence of authority to do business in the state of the project is expired (03-31-2022), however through an on-line lookup their license is current with an expiration date of 03-31-2024; 2) a list of suppliers was not provided or an indication that all materials are in-house; and 3) a list of subcontractors was not provided or an indication that all work would be performed without the need for subcontractors. In our opinion these items are considered minor deviations.

The apparent low bid is \$105,000.00 submitted by Anglers, LLC. The second ranked bid is \$222,500.00 and approximately 112% more than the apparent low bid and the third ranked bid is \$226,317.00 and approximately 116% more than the apparent low bid. The second and third ranked bids are within 2% of each other.

### Recommendation

The analysis of the apparent low bid is less than the Engineer's Estimate of \$157,146.00 dated February 11, 2022. Based on a conversation with the apparent low bidder there does not appear to be any misunderstanding of the scope of work. Therefore, it is our recommendation that the bid of \$105,000.00 from Anglers, LLC be accepted.

As we are looking to ensure the services we provide to the community are recaptured, there are only a few fees outside of taxes that contribute to the general fund. Development is one of those areas.

As we look at our surrounding compared communities we quickly realize that the Town of Abingdon has lower review fees for permitting than specifically Bristol Virginia and Washington County. If we look at the averages for the region – we find we are still lower than the averages.

The cost of providing services to maintain a safe community where people can confidently purchase homes and commercial properties, knowing they have been carefully planned and inspected is valuable. These services are the building blocks to confidence in the future development of the community.

Staff has now workshopped the proposed fees twice with the Town Council. We are presenting this final fee schedule for review. A resolution was adopted June 7, 2021 that authorizes the Town Manager to approve the final version of the fee schedule. Staff will request a signature of approval on the final original version of the fee schedule.
