AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNCIL FOR THE TOWN OF ABINGDON, VIRGINIA TO ADD Code, Chapter 50 – OFFENSES AND MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS Loitering Section 50-10

WHEREAS, pursuant to Virginia Code § 15.2-926, localities may regulate

loitering; and

WHEREAS, Town Council wishes to adopt an ordinance regulating these activities:

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the council of the Town of Abingdon that:

1. Should any section or provision of this ordinance be decided to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity or constitutionality of any other section or provision of this ordinance or the Code of the Town of Abingdon, Virginia; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that Code, *Chapter 50 – OFFENSES AND MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS*, *Loitering*, *Section 50-10*, be added to read as follows:

Loitering.

- (a) Purpose. The purpose of this section is to ensure the free passage of pedestrians and vehicles on the public rights-of-way, to ensure free access to public places and to prevent activities that threaten the public safety or threaten a breach of the peace.
- (b) Definitions. The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this section, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this subsection, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

Loiter means to stand around or remain at, to sit or lie upon, or to park or remain parked in a motor vehicle at any public place or any place open to the public and to engage in any conduct prohibited under this section. The term "loiter" also means to collect, gather, congregate, or be a member of a group or a crowd of people who are gathered together in any public place or any place open to the public and to engage in any conduct prohibited under this law.

Place open to the public means any place open to the public or any place to which the public is invited or may reasonably expect to be invited, and in, on, or around any privately owned place of business, private parking lot, or private institution,
