## Finance & Treasury

The year-end financial and reconciliations have been completed.

The Treasurer's Office continues to process payments and work on delinquent notifications. This is an ongoing process.

### Public Works

- The new banner poles have been ordered and are expected to be delivered in January.
- The material is being ordered for their installation.

## • Street Department/Solid Waste/Central Garage-

- 1. Signalization repairs at Cummings St./Valley St. (Ongoing)
- 2. Pedestrian signal repair at Main St./Russell Rd. (Completed)
- 3. Sinkhole repair at Smartview Drive (Ongoing)
- 4. Various sign and sidewalk repairs were conducted.
- 5. With the extreme cold, paving that has been done near utility pipes can contract causing a pothole type result. If these are observed, please note the exact location, take a picture, and notify public works.

## • Facilities Maintenance/Parks & Grounds-

1. Woodard & Curran- Wastewater Operations WCWRF- Meeting weekly with WCWRF staff to coordinate plans, needs, and operations for the plant and collection system.

2. The Lane Group- Sanitary Sewer Evaluation Study (SSES) - An amendment to the original task order was approved for adding the evaluation of six sewer pump stations within the system for \$35,000. PER final report expected by June. (Awaiting revision from comments provided)

## • Wastewater Contract Operations

- 1. Woodward and Curran is currently in operation at the treatment plant. The plant manager, who oversees the day-to-day operations, meets with town staff regularly.
- 2. Lane Group provided 80 trouble spots for Inflow & Infiltration reduction for the collections department to repair. (Ongoing)

- 1. Smart Scale-Hillman Highway/Old Eleven Drive Rte. 609. Project has begun. (Project has started VDOT Administered)
- 2. Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) VDOT portal open for new applications.
- 3. Transportation Alternatives Set Aside (TAP) Prescreened application for Park Street Phase II moved to full application. (In scoring)
- 4. VDOT Parallel Route Signal Improvements- VDOT notified us that they expect signal improvement plans along US-11/ Main Street corridor, Jonesboro Road, and Cummings Street awarded. (Preconstruction meeting November 30, 2023, Start date April 22, 2024)
- 5. Exit 17 I-81 NB onramp signage- VDOT completed the new signage for I-81 Northbound onramp signage to alleviate wrong turn onto Country Club Drive.



## Fire Department:

The Town of Abingdon Fire Department responded to 50 incidents in the month of December. Responses occurring inside the Town of Abingdon Corporation Limits totaled 22 (44%) with 28 (56%) occurring outside the corporation limits.

For the month of December, a total of 402 staff hours were consumed responding to fire/rescue-related calls for service. Of those, 265 personnel hours (65.9%) were expended for responses outside the corporate limits and 137 personnel hours (34.1%) were used inside of the Town of Abingdon.

There were 23 motor vehicle crashes, responsible for 46% of the calls in December. The Department also responded to 9 (18%) fires during the month.

The Average Response time for calls in Town was 5.97 minutes while the average response time for calls outside the corporate limits was 9.72 minutes. Response time, from the previous month, in Town was decreased by 8.4% and calls outside the corporate limits saw a decrease of 4%.

### Parks & Recreation

#### Coomes Center

- 1. We have finished sign-ups for youth volleyball, we currently have 180 kids registered, we had to close registration early because we were limited on space.
- 2. We currently have a total of 1,802 memberships at the Coomes Center with a total of 2,987 members.
- 3. During the month of December, we generated \$30,027.23, compared to December 2022 we generated \$27,665.60.
- 4. We participated in the Christmas Parade. We had staff and children from our Afterschool program on the float. It is a fun event for the children and staff.
- 5. We hosted breakfast with Santa, we had 200 children register to participate. Food Country helped provide breakfast for the children and their families. In total there were 600 people that attended this program.
- 6. We had 10,039 entrances in to the Coomes Center this month that were logged by our traffic counting system.

#### The Meadows

- 1. We are preparing for next year by completing some routine maintenance and planning for next year's nutrient management plan for the fields and grassy areas.
- 2. The pump track construction is complete we are working with a local volunteer organization to help assist the Town with daily maintenance.
- 3. We are waiting on specific install dates for the recirculation tank.
- 4. We have filled the 2024 tournament schedule with 33 tournament weekends with the Little League State Softball Tournament scheduled for July.
