A meeting of the Infrastructure Advisory Committee was held on Thursday, March 7, 2024, at 5:30 pm in Arthur Campbell room in the Municipal Building.

- 1. Call to Order: Mike Owens, Chairman.
- 2. Approval of minutes:
 - On motion of Michael Surrett, seconded by Otey Dudley, approved the January 4, 2024, minutes were approved following minutes with corrections:
 - The minutes were approved unanimously.

3. Opening comments to the Infrastructure Advisory Committee – Mike Owens, Chairman.

- *i. Mr. Owens did not have any opening comments.*
- 4. Discussion regarding planning for future infrastructure projects- *Mike Owens, Chairman*
 - a. Mr. Owens requested the committee members to bring back ideas of some projects they see that would be of importance to the community, and infrastructure. This would help create a master plan. Mr. Surrett expanded on the purpose of the town's infrastructure, and that is a wide range of topics, i.e....

wastewater, transportation, signalization. Is important to plan for future projects, and the growth of the community.

- b. It was discussed that the former Comprehensive plan, under the previous Town Manager, and the current infrastructure plans be combined into one Master Plan.
- c. A discussion was held regarding project funding, and how you cannot mix general fund and enterprise budgets.
- d. A lengthy discussion ensued about the additional sewer projects and the sewer collection we receive from Washington County, as well as how the billing is calculated. Currently, we are working and collecting data, to ensure we are correctly billing the county.
- 5. Discussion VDOT Project Pipeline Sturdy for US-11/Main Street for infrastructure projects – Michael Surrett, Director Public Works, Mayana Rice, Asst. Town Manager
 - This is a study we engaged with VDOT several months ago, to study the Main Street Corridor, from Hillman Highway to Porterfield Highway.
 - b. A consultant was brought in and looked at the different road sections, to come up with, plans for potential Smart Scale Projects.
 - c. Samples were provided to the Town of the projects the consultant provided.
 - d. A meeting was held with VDOT about the proposed Smart Scale projects.
 - e. A decision is requested to be made about the projects presented, on Tuesday March 12, 2024. A meeting will be held with members of the Town Council, regarding a decision.
 - f. The projects that held the most interest was Remsburg Dr, Cummings St. and Main St... An in-depth discussion continued about the top three projects.
 - g. Mr. Michael Surrett stated we would be submitting two applications.
 - h. The NPO will be submitting on our behalf, French Moore Blvd. extension to Stone Mill Rd, this would complete the connection from Cook St. to Jonesboro Rd.
 - i. VDOT let us know they have the cost down on this project and they feel it should get a good push in the high priority direction.
 - j. The Smart Scale process opens this month, VDOT will be doing the pre application process. We will follow up and review

everything. This will eventually be coming before the Town Council for resolution.

- k. The pre-application is due April 1, 2024. Once it's been submitted, it will be screened. June will open the full application; we will have from June through August to prepare the full application. Then will be scored in the Fall. Then we should hear the results by late February or March 2025.
- 6. Discussion on Sanitary Sewer Evaluation Study Phase 1 Kevin Woley, Senior Project Manager
 - a. We are currently finishing up some easements.
 - b. Everything has been completed, all we are waiting on are some final permits from DEQ & Army Corp of Engineers. No Final comments were made by February 25, 2024, as this was the deadline.
 - c. The Town Creek is also part of this project, we have received notification it will be under general permit.
 - d. We are finalizing some easements, to determine whether we can do descriptive verses another alternative.
 - e. Cam is currently working through as to what direction we proceed.
 - f. Tyler Vencill has been doing some additional research as well as some title searches to assist with moving the project along.
 - g. We will be holding some public meetings as well as other means of communication with the properties being affected.
 - h. Once we have finalized the current research projects, and public meetings, we should be able to put the project out for bid.
- 7. Reports on Infrastructure Projects- See Memorandum of Progress Report
 - a. Tyler Vencill; has a question regarding trestle repairs.
 - i. What is the intention for the parking area along Watauga Rd, this is currently closed, is it going to be reopened?
 - 1. At this time, it will remain closed after the repairs have been completed.
 - b. Village Blvd Project: Bids are in, and Inland Construction got the bid. Our engineered estimate for the project was \$132,000.00. The winning bid was for \$62,000.00.
 - c. SmartView Ln; We have been having an issue with a sinkhole opening for a few years now, with what we thought was a storm drain that crossed the road in that area.

- i. We had a crew go out and investigate the area and found after having Les Sutherland with the Lane group look at it. It was a karst area. We filled it with water to try and determine where it was going. We were unable to find an outlet source of the water. It was then determined to be ground fissure, which is a long narrow crack or linear opening in the Earth. It was then sealed with 32 yards of flowable fill, and let it sit for 2 weeks. Once it sits-up we completed the filling and paving over the area.
