Finance & Treasurer:

Treasurer reports real estate taxes have been processed and mailed 5/1/2024. The Treasurer's office is contacting delinquent businesses regarding their business license.

Public Works:

Public Works is actively working on multiple projects. The project page on the Public Works part of the Town website is up to date. IworQ Public Works software data input ongoing.

Street Department/Solid Waste/Central Garage

- Creeper Trail bathroom parking lot re-graveled.
- Cummings St/Valley St signalization repairs completed
- Spray sidewalks, curb & gutter with glyphosate and flumisheild.
- Installed topsoil for plantings on Jonesboro Rd median island

Began the process of training an existing staff member for heavy equipment operation.



Fire Department:

41 calls answered - 46% in Town and 54% in the County. 46% were motor vehicle crashes, 4 responses to fires. 415.5 t total hours responding to call, 29% in Town and 71% in the County.

Parks & Recreation:

The Meadows:

• Hosted 78 events including tournaments, practices, games and other events.

- Placer information for March reports a total 21.7k visitors to the park
- Bike Park has been heavily used and the grass continues to grow
- Splashpad recirculation tank installation scheduled for May 6th An employee will be trained to operate the equipment

Coomes Center:

- April was very busy for our active aging crew, including hosting a health fair at the Coomes Center with 70 participants; a Barter trip to see Ring of Fire with a behind-the-scenes tour with 25 total participants; and a crew met with District 3. An average of 35 people per Social Joe event (two times a week).
- The membership count includes 2,198 with a total of 3,254 members.

- Generated \$75,433.58 across both the Coomes Center and The Meadows.
- Prepping for the outdoor pool opening, drained and ready to fill. Awaiting installation of new boiler on May 6th
- Continued work on ARPA projects, including concrete installation for the storage building and pool around the shower area. Public Works is working on repairing the curbing and having pavement completed
- Registrations included 205 swimming lessons, 90 summer camp, and hosted 240 kids on field trip on the playground/lunch

Community Development:

Drafted ordinance update for new environmental laws that affect ESC and SWM to go before Planning Commission in May and to Town Council on June 3.

Code Compliance staff opened 9 code cases for April, removed approximately 30 signs from right of way, performed re-inspections on existing open cases.

Tourism:

- Hosted Travel journalists for four days and introduced them to all things Abingdon.
- Took over the Bristol Welcome Center at Exit 1 and restocked several times over the month.
- Set up a welcome table for a Public Health Innovation conference at the SWVA Higher Education Center.
- Tallied votes and prepared awards for the Best of Abingdon.
- We developed a co-op with 11 businesses to place a full-page ad in Our State Magazine.
- We formed a co-op with Virginia Highlands Festival and Barter Theatre for a full-page ad in Our State Magazine.
- Opened the VA Creeper Trail Welcome Center, in mid-April. Hours are 10 AM to 4 PM, Friday through Monday.
- Hiring new employees to cover hours at the trail and additional at the visitor center.
- Continuing to work with the VHCD on the Appalachian Highlands Dental Clinic Grant.
- Met with Appalachian Long Distance Hikers Association, who will host a 4-day conference in October.
- Welcomed two groups of Road Scholars to downtown Abingdon. They are hosted by SWVA 4-H Center.

- Welcome booth for E&H Open House.
- Worked on new "Visit Abingdon" website.
- Worked with Global Heroes for print and digital ad campaign in Chicago Tribune & Wall Street Journal.
- Worked with Our State Magazine for a full-page print advertisement & digital marketing campaign.
- Drone work completed for Fairview, VCT and Downtown Abingdon.
- Graphic design work for advertisements, etc.
